MAIN FINDINGS

In relation to 'integrated food supporting system', the needs for expanding the budget of agrifood supporting program for vulnerables was suggested. Also, it was emphasized that there are needs to support more food to foreign countries which are in vulnerable situation. For effective program operation, it was emphasized to make collaboration between central government, local governments and NGOs, to train field experts specializing in food, and to link food supply and education. Regarding the 'improving public health and nutrition status', the importance of education to change public perception for food was emphasized. In order to change public perception, the expansion of education on importance of agriculture and rural areas. The expansion of curriculum to improve public awareness was also proposed. In addition, opinions on importance of balancing the issue of 'nutrition imbalance' with the issue of 'lack of nutrition' were presented along with the needs for customizing support for each target to solve this problem.

In relation to 'reinforcing agrifood safety management', the provision of food safety related information and expansion of food safety communication were suggested. Also, the importance of reinforcing safety measures for microbial hazards was discussed to prevent food poisoning accidents.

In addition, the importance of inter-ministerial cooperation and governance for implementing various policies, and the necessity of promoting food policies that are incorporated into daily life even after the UN Food System Summit are presented.
