MAIN FINDINGS

- The dialogue highlighted the key challenges and threats to Egypt food systems and their transformation toward sustainable forms of production and consumption. These include water scarcity, population growth, urbanization, persistent food safety and quality problems and the prevalence of unhealthy consumption patterns leading to concerning levels of malnutrition among others.
