


## **4. DIALOGUE FOCUS & OUTCOMES**

### **MAJOR FOCUS**

This second stage dialogue reinforced many of the findings of the first national dialogue and went more into depth regarding the vision statements provided there. It highlighted that many solutions are already in place on a local and regional level and that in fact, often government and government agencies are lagging behind. The dialogue presented innovative regional businesses as inspiration. It also highlighted some of the obstacles specific to sparsely populated areas with long distances.
